






# Who can apply?

- Resident of NY State
- Active farmer (Full or Part-time)
- Any commodity
- Annual gross farm income of \$10,000 -\$349,999, OR dairy farm less than 1000 mature cows



#### JOHN MAY FARM SAFETY FUND



### How does it work?

- Simple application
- Safety survey from NYCAMH
- Pays 50% of the cost up to \$5000
  - Cattle handling equipment
  - Electrical upgrades
  - Eye wash stations
  - Silo ladders

- Extra-riders
- Bystander runovers
- Starting a tractor while standing on the ground

#### Runovers are 100% preventable

- NO EXTRA RIDERS
- Watch for bystanders and small children
- Start from the operator's seat only





# Hi-vis clothing



# When is hi-vis clothing useful?

- Low light situations
- Around vehicles
- Protects workers from being hit by equipment



# Be safe, be seen!



#### **Use Three Points of Contact**

- Proper way to mount and dismount:
  - Always face the machine
  - Use hand-holds and every step
  - Keep three points of contact with machinery when mounting and dismounting

 Never jump from a tractor or dismount facing outward





### **PTO Safety**


- Spinning motion of PTO creates a 'Wrapping Hazard'
- 540 rpm shaft spins
   9 times per second
   (7 feet)
- Can pull in loose clothing








### **Hydraulic Systems**

   use your hand









# **Engulfment Hazards**





### **Engulfment Hazards**

- Silage faces can collapse at any time
- Never walk up to the face of the silage, or work near the edge of the silage
- For every 1' of height, stay back 3'





# **Confined Spaces**



- Identify
- Warning signs
- Never enter confined spaces
  - Train workers to stay out



### **Confined Spaces**



- 1. Is large enough and so configured that an employee can bodily enter and perform assigned work; and
- 2. Has limited or restricted means for entry of exit; and
- 3. Is not designed for continuous employee occupation.

### **Permit Required Confined Space**



If it has a physical or toxic hazards




## **Recent Manure Pit Fatalities**



#### **Hazards**



- 1. Oxygen Deficiency
- 2. Presence of Combustible Gases
- 3. Presence of Toxic Gases



None of these conditions can be seen

#### **Manure Gas Production**



### **Increased risk with:**


- Higher temperatures increase microbial activity & gas production
- Still air conditions
- Temperature inversions



### **Emergency Situations**



- Call 911!
- Never enter the space, unless you have had the proper training and equipment to do so
- Invite your local Fire Department for a tour of your facilities
  - Annually

# **Hearing Safety**

Hazards – Safe noise levels are below 85 decibels Many farm machines exceed this by 2 to 3 times

The noise levels of many tractors & skid steers is around 95 to 100 decibels

Hearing loss is permanent, occurs gradually Warning signs – ears hurt, ring, temporary deafness

- Plugs










- Small and flying particles


