4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Thirty-three Herkimer County 4-H members exhibited their animals the 67th Annual Farmers Museum Junior Livestock Show Cooperstown along with other 4-H members from the nine-county region.



Twenty-three 4-Her's attended the rabbit and poultry clinic held at the 4-H Office to teach youth the proper way to care for and prepare their rabbits and chickens for show.

Forty-two 4-H members from Herkimer and Oneida



Counties participated in the 1st Annual Mohawk Valley Dairy & Livestock Sale at the Herkimer County Fairgrounds. Seven youth then sold a total of three

hogs, three dairy steers and two beef steers in the auction that culminated the event.

Sixty-three Herkimer participated in various animal shows while 40 youth exhibited their 4-H projects in the youth building at the Herkimer County Fair. Twenty two



youth also participated the Livestock in Skillathon/Dairy Challenge Contest.

At the NYS Fair, youth exhibited 4-H projects in the youth building, worked as Teen Leaders and participated in the robotics challenge, dairy challenge and dairy judging contests.

4-H members participated in a nine week Shooting Sports safety course at the Ilion Fish & Game Club.

AGRICULTURE PROGRAM

The CNYDFC team is working with a NY Farm Viability grant for selecting malting barley varieties. A field day was held at a



farm currently growing variety trials. All plots have now been harvested for yields and samples have been sent to a lab for malting quality analysis.

Sixty people participated in an "open house/drive yourself tour" of twelve dairy farms that have transitioned from tie to free stall facilities. Many stopped at multiple farms.

HUMAN ECOLOGY PROGRAM

Creating Healthy Places (CHP) summer intern, Shae -Leigh Paparella-Voorhees interviewed farmers

market managers and farmers to prepare a report to summarize farmers' market accomplishments; identify gaps; and plan sustainability projects after the CHP grant ends in 2015.



"Rethink Your Drink" presentations were shared at eight Summer Feeding Programs in Cold Brook, Poland, Ilion, Mohawk, Herkimer, Little Falls, and West Winfield reaching 279 youth and staff.



Eighteen "Enjoy Local Produce" tasting demonstrations were presented nine at Markets Farmers' Herkimer County 1585 reaching over consumers.
