EXPLORERS WANTED: MARS BASE CAMP MISSION SPECIALISTS

The race to land humans on Mars is on! The 2020 National 4-H STEM Challenge explores sending humans on a mission to Mars, with the activity, Mars Base Camp! Developed by Google and Virginia Cooperative Extension, Mars Base Camp is a collection of activities that teaches kids ages 8-14 STEM skills like mechanical engineering, physics, computer science, and agriculture.

This year, 4-H is offering two different sized Mars Base Camp kits to ensure young people everywhere, regardless of internet access or family resources, can participate.



Club Officers assist in running your club meetings. Your club's meetings help keep everyone informed of scheduled events, deadlines and new opportunities. 4-H Club officers will learn how to carry out their role whether it is President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, News Reporter, Song and Rec Leader, or Healthy Living Officer.

Holding a 4-H Club Officer position provides you with the opportunity to gain valuable youth development skills, such as: Leadership, Record Keeping, as well as Verbal and Written Communication skills. As you start seeking opportunities employment having these credentials on a resume will set you apart from many others. Employers are seeking individuals that can demonstrate commitment, ability to meet deadlines, organization and attention to details; all traits of those that take on the role of a 4-H Club Officer.

UTICA ZOO AND BEAVERSPRITE NATURE CENTER



Beaversprite is looking for 4-H families to help with projects for improving their nature center and trails, in the coming year. The center would like to have a pollinator garden with a beehive and examples of composting methods, spruce up the nature center and build more trails.

Ways you can help:

- Plant a Pollinator and native fruits garden. The garden will include a Milkweed Patch, a pollinator mix, wildlife shrubs and fruits and berries.
- Different composting methods will be demonstrated around the garden (a drum, a pit and open bins) and in the nature swap area (worm bin)
- Cut a path from the garden area to the nature play area and add a shade garden in a raised bed.
- Add signage in nature play area about woodland invasive species – honeysuckle, garlic mustard and buckthorn
- Clean out lower level of the nature center, paint and put up shelves and baskets. Use the space for camps, the nature swap area and a meeting place for the weekly activities.

Volunteering is a way to be involved in 4-H activities and get outside at the same time.
















4-H MEMBER/VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION EVENT

4-H STARR 2021


