PULLORUM TESTING

When: June 28 2pm - 3:30pm Where: 4-H Office

Requirement to exhibit at the county fair.

Birds at least 4 months (16 wks) old: Chickens, turkeys, guinea fowl, peacocks. Pheasants & quail eligible.

Birds obtained from an NPIP certified hatchery/flock (or from a feed store) may exhibit with a copy of the NPIP certificate or receipt showing the NPIP information. These expire in one year.

Appointments required. Call Jenn to set up yours.

Due to COVID-19:

- All producers arriving at the testing site must not be showing symptoms of COVID-19
- All producers attending Pullorum clinic event must not have been in contact with anyone who has had a positive COVID-19 test result in the past 14 days.
- Only one person/producer allowed to enter the testing site to hold birds during Pullorum testing.
- All producers handling birds must wear a face covering and be 13 years of age and older.
- All other producer or family members must remain at the car.

BEGINNING DAIRY LEADER PROGRAM

"Helping Young People Explore Post-Secondary Agricultural Education and Career Opportunities"

The Beginning DAIRY LEADER program gives high school participants the opportunity to explore post-secondary agricultural education and career opportunities in a networking environment through interaction with faculty and students, college planning, and personal development.

Program Cost: \$100

Eligibility/Requirements:

- 1. High school students entering at least their sophomore year. High school graduates are not eligible.
- 2. Have potential interest in dairy industry careers.
- 3. Have an interest in pursuing post-secondary education in agriculture.
- 4. Can reasonably commit to one Saturday program in November of current year and February, March, April, and June of the following year.

HERKIMER COUNTY FAIR

The Herkimer County Fair generously invites all 4-H members to come show the public what your 4-H story is all about. Whether it is showing animals, displaying exhibits in the youth building, making a project with the public, or a cooking demonstration; all are part of showcasing your 4-H SPARK.

Now is the time to assist 4-H members in preparing for the Herkimer County Fair. An early start will help insure that the Fair is a positive and fun experience for everyone. Many last minute problems and disappointments can be avoided by making plans now. 4-H projects for the past 2 years can be entered at the Herkimer County Fair. No projects that have been previously exhibited for a premium are allowed.

Fair time is fast approaching, so here are some dates to remember. Non-animal exhibits can be entered at the fair on **August 15** from 10 am - 2 pm. If you would like to help out on the day of judging, please contact the 4-H office. We need adults to help with evaluating; and youth to help as assistants. All exhibits are released to be taken home on **August 23** from 9 am - 11 am.

THE YOUTH BUILDING AT THE NY STATE FAIR WILL NOT BE OPEN THIS YEAR!

The exhibits are not going to the NY State Fair in 2021, so all 4-H exhibits at the Herkimer County fair will need to be picked up on **August 23**. Any exhibits not picked up will remain at the Herkimer County Fair. If your exhibits were chosen to go to State Fair, we'll be glad to take photos of your exhibit to be entered at the virtual NY State Fair showcase. You must fill out the Exhibitor Entry Statement to be submitted with the photos.



Here is a checklist of "to dos" to get you started:

- Go over the Herkimer County Fair book with your 4-H members. Make sure they have a copy. Read it together. Plan exhibits they will bring to the fair; and what preparation the exhibit will need.
- Assist members to fill out their entry blank and exhibit tags COMPLETELY, prior to the fair. It makes for a much smoother day; and less stress on everyone if you come with all your paperwork completed ahead of time.
- Explain the conference evaluation style of judging to members. Conference judging helps the member feel at ease and in a more receptive frame of mind. Conference evaluation is often easier for the judge. The member gains a greater benefit from the experience. Conference evaluation eliminates the question of why an item received a certain ribbon, therefore, making the evaluation of project work more educational.
- Explain the Danish System. Within the Danish System, each exhibit be it a birdhouse or a flower is compared to the ideal for the exhibit given the exhibitor's experience & age. Exhibits are not placed in a ranking, rather each item is judged on its own merit. Participants receive either a blue ribbon (excellent), red ribbon (good) or a white ribbon (worthy). Green ribbons (participation) are distributed to exhibits that are display only. The emphasis is placed on the process of learning, not necessarily the end product.

REMEMBER, it's a well-known fact (with historical basis, ask any old 4-H member) that those who take an active part in the fair have more FUN!!!

After I finish high school I would like to get a job at an animal shelter to help animals who need me.




