

## S2FacDisagree

Calendar is terrible for working families. At least in the current calendar, February break lines up. Here we have two breaks, neither of which align with iCSD

---

The spring week long break is too early.

---

It's silly to have spring break in the winter time.

---

If you are going to move spring break, the number one factor is unison with Ithaca schools.

---

Spring break comes too early. A week long break so early in the semester breaks up the rhythm of a class. Let's have our spring break in the Spring, when the weather is nice! Travel in and out of Ithaca can be quite difficult at this time of year.

---

I think I prefer the longer break later.

---

I don't like the reversed order of the longer break. The long break should continue to be in April.

---

shorter break followed by longer break seems like a better distribution of break following the long holiday break of December/January

---

The late break is creative but strange..... (not a helpful comment, I know)

---

Earlier break is better, but late graduation is still problematic.

---

Classes end too late. Summer internships start the week BEFORE Memorial Day. I don't like the earlier spring break.

---

S2 doesn't do much to address the late exam period and late commencement, and having the full week break so close to winter break is not productive

---

I think it would be better to have a later week-long break that attempts to overlap with ICSD spring break. There does not need to be such a long time between the last break and the end of the academic year.

---

Full week break comes too soon: 1) Need for break is lower so soon after semester start; 2) Earlier break more likely to lead to winter travel disruptions.

It makes more sense to have spring break actually in the spring/mid-way through the semester.

Putting a full week break in early March would reduce what is accomplished in classes in the first 60% of the semester. As a result I feel, it would reduce what can be accomplished overall. The current ordering of the breaks takes advantage of the fact that students and teachers have more energy and motivation early on.

Start and end dates are too late. Switching the breaks does not achieve anything useful.

It starts later and we don't need a big break at the start of the semester.

One of the main things that Cornell should be looking at is syncing its Spring break with the local K-12. I can't believe that this isn't part of the conversation. If Cornell is TRULY dedicated to work/life balance, this should be on the table.

Don't like the early Spring Break, seems out of place with most other schools. Don't know what a Wednesday start buys us. Stay with Tuesday and pull exam/study days back one day.

Not coordinated with ICSD; partial week in late January is odd use of time.

Timing is off. We don't need the long break earlier in semester.

Week off comes too soon in the semester with long period of mostly uninterrupted work (except for short two day break in April). I would rather have spring break last week of March.

Provides a break in March, much better in April!

I think it's better to have the shorter break earlier. School stress has built up less at that point and the weather is worse.

Spring Break is too early in this option: there isn't enough content in the courses to digest before taking this elongated Break.

Worse--no overlapping breaks with ICSD.

None of these breaks aligns with the K-12 school breaks, creating a childcare nightmare that is insensitive to faculty with school-aged children and out of step with Cornell's family friendly mantra.

Glad to keep the Jan break, but it benefits few if anyone to put a 1-week break in early March.

Just shifts days around.

I don't think the spring semester need have two breaks. The old system of a week-long break at nearly the mid-term was ideal.

dont want to have an earlier longer spring break, so dont want to reverse those two breaks

early March long break is too early; we should revert to mid/late March break

This schedule is out-of-sync with most of our peers in that Spring Break comes too early. This is bad for both students and faculty. The first week of March is still cold in most of the continental US, so students looking to get away from Ithaca have restricted opportunities (unless they are wealthy). Many professional meetings are scheduled in the latter half of March/early April specifically to coincide with spring breaks. While our Spring Break does not coincide with every meeting every year, it is great to have an overlap every 2-3 years. This schedule also preserves the Memorial Day graduation, which is much easier on our graduates' families and their travel schedules. I would rank this as #2 out of the 4 possibilities, but behind both the current schedule and option #1.

Same as S1 - eliminating the alignment of Cornell and ICSD February breaks. I agree that Spring break is too late, but it can be moved while leaving the February break as it is.

It is important that the breaks align with the local public schools--otherwise faculty with kids can never take a break.

Same objections as to S1.

I travel over spring break, and integrate this travel into classes. I don't think that early spring break would give quite enough time for preparation, although I do prefer this to the first option.

puts a long break too early in the semester

I feel like this version makes spring break too early. I don't really feel that the early Feb break and late Spring break are all that problematic.

See previous comments - the school holidays MUST align for those with children. Very important point.

I like the idea of moving spring break up in the semester, but not that far. I think that spring break is too late in the semester and I would be fine eliminating the February break, or just leaving it as is over the President's Day holiday. I do not like any calendar switch that makes the semester go further into May. Our students start their internships later than many of their counterparts from other universities.

The day care situation gets worse because the February break does not coincide with the school district anymore.

A week-long break early is a waste, because students and teachers are not yet out of steam. Having the long break late is better in courses with a large project component, because it provides a natural end to lecture material, and a beginning for project work.

Gets rid of Feb break - adds another later break - all of which create more days to find childcare for working parents.

Even though spring break is late... more time is needed later in the semester for a mental break than earlier. If we think about spring break as a time to relax, step away, and get some rest--and regain energy, that's better later--so that students (and faculty!) can make it through the end!

Please make sure to align Cornell's February and April breaks with those for the Ithaca School District. It is very burdensome on parents when Cornell's breaks do not coincide with that of their children.

Don't like the reversed order of the breaks.

We need the full week off later in the semester. This week off comes way too soon and creates a long and exhausting stretch of time between the first week in March and the end of the school year is way too long.

I do not agree that it is better "academically" to have the first break be the longer one.

Classes resume too late and April two day break isn't necessary.

These changes are not important to me.

If spring break were after 6 full weeks of instruction maybe it would be worth considering.

I am unsure why an early longer break is better academically, but it seems to have the spring break at a different time than our peers.

Doesn't make enough of a difference: the last exam day is the typical start date for summer internships. This makes the exams on the last two days (Monday and even Sunday) very problematic, for CS students (and students for internship programs)

This calendar has no hope of working for people with kids in public school, since these breaks are far from theirs.

The spring breaks in S2 are a week too early. People need to have it around the 7th full week of the term for mental health issues.
