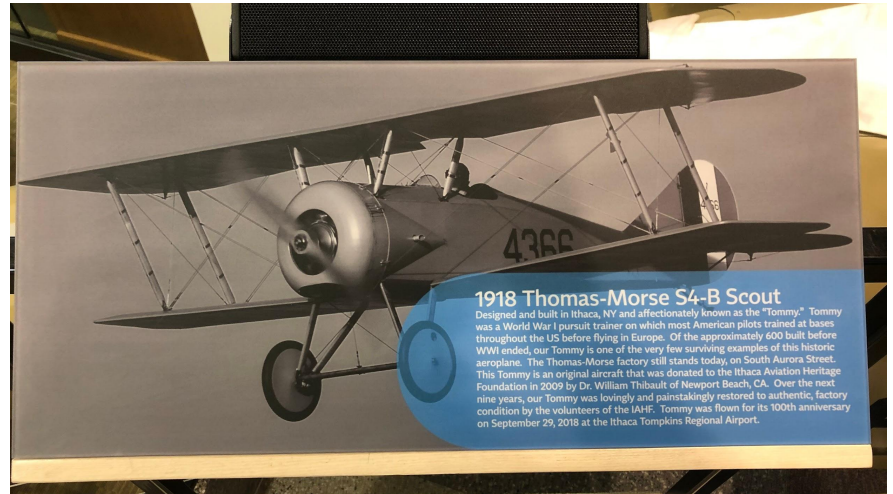

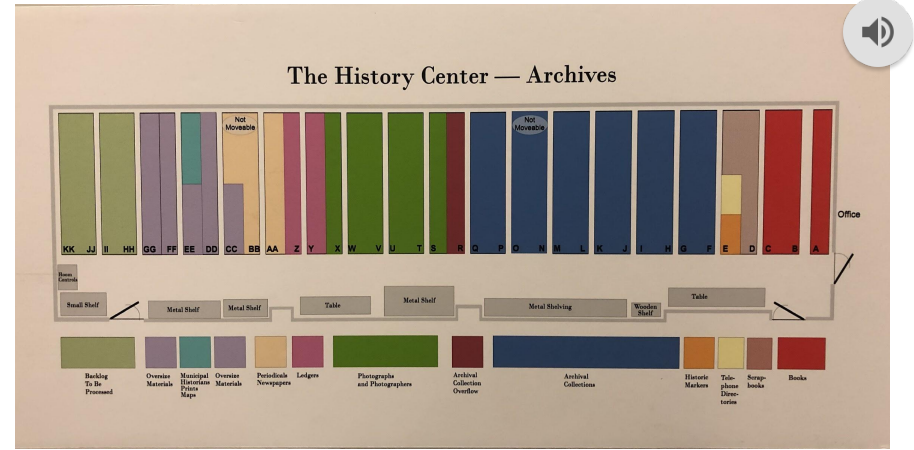

1918 Thomas-Morse S4-B Scout

Designed and built in Ithaca, NY and affectionately known as the "Tommy," Tommy was a World War I pursuit trainer on which most American pilots trained at bases throughout the US before flying in Europe. Of the approximately 600 built before WWI ended, our Tommy is one of the very few surviving examples of this historic aeroplane. The Thomas-Morse factory still stands today, on South Aurora Street. This Tommy is an original aircraft that was donated to the Ithaca Aviation Heritage Foundation in 2009 by Dr. William Thibault of Newport Beach, CA. Over the next nine years, our Tommy was lovingly and painstakingly restored to authentic, factory condition by the volunteers of the IAHF. Tommy was flown for its 100th anniversary on September 29, 2018 at the Ithaca Tompkins Regional Airport.

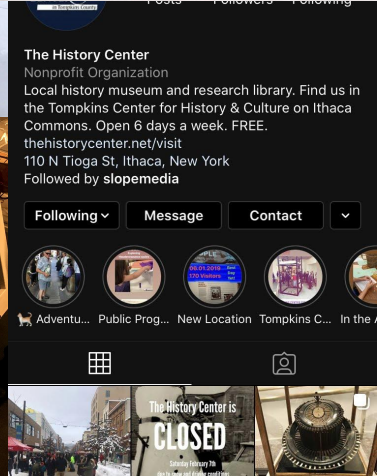

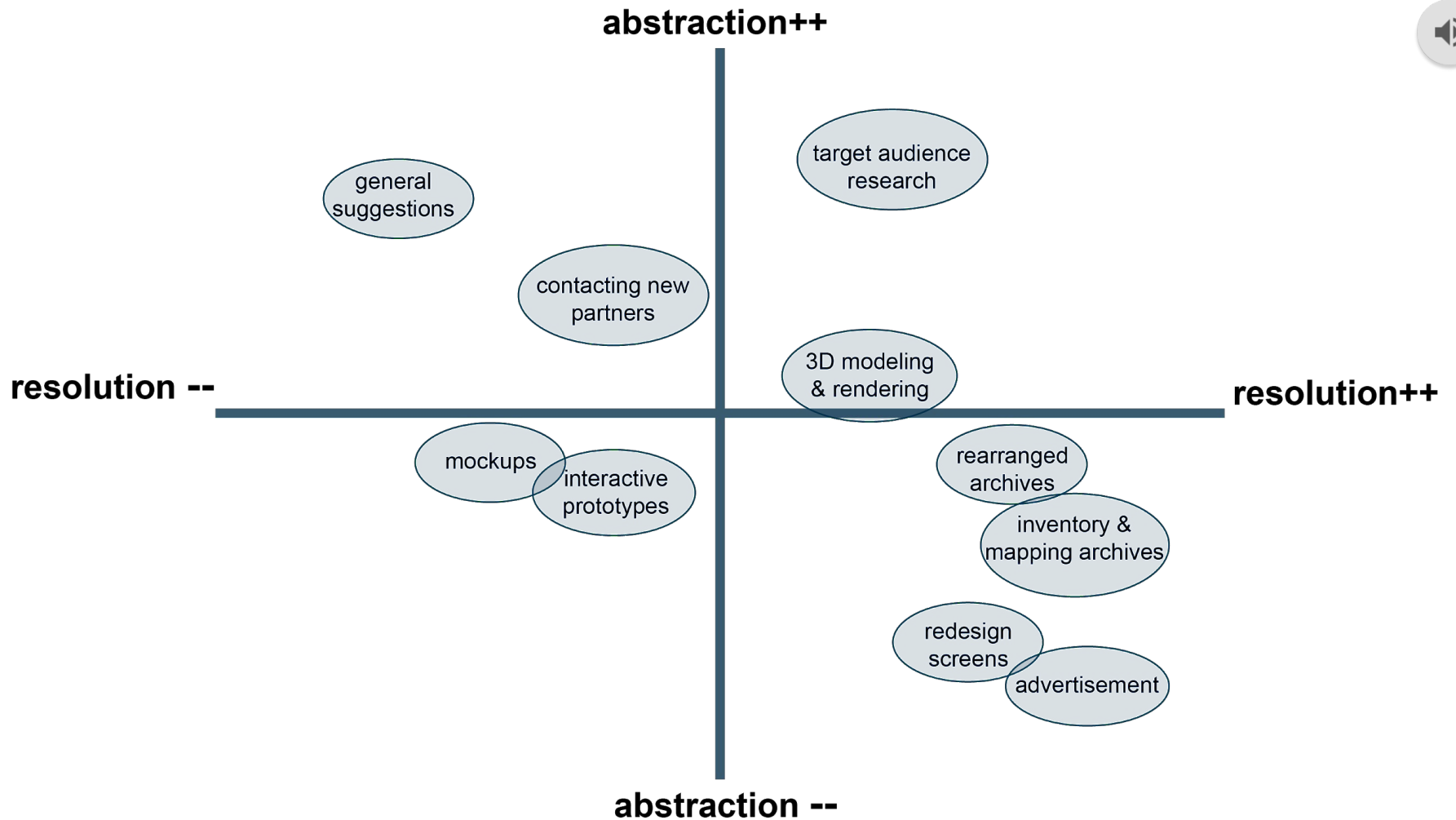
