

2017 VVTG Timeline and Checklist

Big Yields in Small Spaces

December:

- Registration opens on December 8.
- Informational webinar on December 8, 9:30am

February:

- Registration closes on February 1.

March:

- Assemble VVTG beds (see 'Recommended Site Prep' for more details)
- Receive seeds by mail. These seeds will be those to be directly sown early in Spring.
- Webinar on March 20 at 11am: A time to touch base and answer questions.

April:

- When soil is ready to be worked, sow cold hardy vegetable seeds.
- Establish planting and maintenance schedule with volunteers. Create VVfG account for those who will be recording vegetable data.

May:

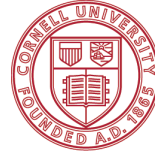
- Plant pick up day at Cornell is May 4.
- Hang up appropriate signage around garden.
- After danger of frost, transplant or direct sow tender crops outside.
- Share photos of planted beds.
- Perform general maintenance each week: water, weed, thin, pinch and harvest.
- May 15 at 11am, VVfG database tutorial webinar

June:

- Continue to succession plant lettuce and other noted crops every 2-3 weeks to ensure a continuous harvest.
- Share photos of VVTG progress.
- Perform general maintenance each week: water, weed, thin, pinch and harvest. For harvested crops, enter data into VVfG.

July:

- Plant crops that will grow into the Fall.
- Share photos of VVTG progress.
- Perform general maintenance each week: water, weed, thin, pinch and harvest. For harvested crops, enter data into VVfG.
- Webinar on July 10 at 11am: A time to touch base and answer questions



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August & September:

- Share photos of VVTG progress.
- Perform general maintenance each week: water, weed, thin, pinch and harvest.
For harvested crops, enter data into VVfG.
- Plant cover crops in September.

October:

- Plant garlic and prep garden beds for winter.
- Complete the VVTG Feedback form by October 16.
