

2022 Vegetable Variety Trial Garden Project

"Cultural Roots of the Americas"

The Vegetable Variety Trial Garden project (VVTG) is for Cornell Cooperative Extension programs around NYS who are cultivating vegetable demonstration gardens.

Our 2022 trial will feature vegetables with connections to cultures from Central America, South America, the Caribbean, and Indigenous Peoples of New York.

Participating counties can choose the 9 bed design or a 6 bed option.

We hope you will join us! We will have some new and very unique crops this coming year!

Participating CCE programs receive:

- A garden design plan, reporting checklist, and interpretive signage to print and display with their VVTG beds.
- A template for your Local Program Plan of Work and Success Story.
- Seeds and transplants for the 2022 trial.
- Support and guidance.

Participating CCE programs:

- Plant, maintain, and harvest.
- Can choose to grow all 9 beds or the 6 bed design.
- Print and display VVTG signs by the beds they are growing.
- Enter variety data into the Vegetable Varieties for Gardeners web forum.
- Share photos of their VVTG projects during the growing season (plants mid-season, plants mature before harvest, harvested vegetables).
- Complete a mid-season progress report and a post VVT survey.
