Middle Tennessee State University announces the availability of the Underrepresented Minority Dissertation Fellowship Program. The purpose of the Underrepresented Minority Dissertation Fellowship Program is to enhance diversity in research, teaching, and service at MTSU through the recruitment of underrepresented minority graduate students from across the country who are completing dissertation research.

Fellows will teach one course each semester in an area related to their academic preparation and a need of the department hosting the fellow. Fellows will be expected to devote significant time to the completion of the dissertation. Fellows will also work with a faculty mentor and will be involved with co-curricular activities including the university's cultural diversity initiatives.

Fellows will receive fiscal year faculty appointments (August 1 - July 31) and will be eligible for benefits including health insurance. Salary is \$30,000. Fellows must be eligible for employment. Additionally, fellows will receive support for research, professional travel, and other related expenses. It is expected that fellows will not be employed outside of the University or receive additional fellowships or awards during the fellowship period unless approved by the University.

Excellence in teaching, research/creative activity and service is expected for all positions. MTSU seeks candidates committed to using integrative technologies in teaching.

Fellows must be dissertation stage doctoral degree candidates studying in a field taught at MTSU.

Preference will be given to persons in disciplines in which minorities are traditionally underrepresented, and who have a willingness to participate in MTSU's diversity initiatives.

College of Education – Two Positions. 115050, 116270. Ed.D. Program. Doctoral degree in a field of study related to PreK-12 public education assessment, learning, and/ or school improvement required. Candidates must possess a research agenda or a record of scholarly research focused on assessment, learning, or school improvement applications in PreK-12 schools or school systems. Must provide evidence of successful experience teaching and leading in PreK-12 public school settings. Selected candidates should expect to teach courses with the intention of developing into a faculty member who may meet instructional or program needs in the Ed.D. Program as well as other courses needed. Serve on doctoral, departmental, college, and University committees. Ed.D. courses taught on weekends. Expected to engage in research and public service initiatives. Requires assisting area school districts in school improvement efforts.

Center for Dyslexia – One Position. 022010. Murfree Chair of Excellence. A record of research and teaching in areas related to dyslexia and other literacy related problems required. Responsibilities include research and publication in the study and treatment of dyslexia, graduate-level teaching, and securing funding to further the work of the Tennessee Center for the Study and Treatment of Dyslexia at MTSU. Ongoing involvement in research and professional publication expected. Terminal degree in the appropriate field, (e.g., Special Education, Psychology, or Reading/Literacy) from an accredited college or university required by appointment date. Rank is professor.
