Growing Striped Bass in New York

This card outlines the basic requirements for growing and importing striped and hybrid striped bass in New York State. Growers must acquire the appropriate licenses and permits through the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).

Permit Requirements

Those growing or holding striped bass or hybrid striped bass must have a <u>Marine Hatchery Permit</u> and, if importing fish from out of state, a <u>Marine Fish Importation Permit</u> is also required.

Importing Striped Bass in New York

Those importing any live fish (marine and freshwater) into New York State must have an accompanying fish health certificate ensuring they are free from potentialy infectious diseases that could impact wild populations according to NYSDEC's <u>fish health regulations</u>.

Fish Health Certificate

The NYSDEC Fish Health Certificate form (provided with marine hatchery or on/ off bottom culture permit for marine species), or equivalent certified health certificate, must be submitted to the NYSDEC by the qualified fish health inspector within seven days of the fish health inspection.
